

## **16-17 F.W. Gavlak and Jefferson School Annex Building-Based Objectives**

1. Parent Involvement: During the 2016-2017 School-Year, Parent Participation will be increased through facilitation of two additional Parent Informational Sessions to be held during evening hours by the Principal and School Support Staff. Two meetings to be scheduled: Meeting 1- October, 2016 for Kindergarten-3rd Grade Parents. Meeting will focus upon introducing parents to reading strategies that can be utilized at home in helping the students become better readers. Meeting 2- January, 2017 for 4-6th Grade Parents. Meeting will focus upon strategies that parents can implement at home in helping to prevent drug and alcohol abuse for students. Parent surveys will be collected from all parents present to plan and facilitate future programming.

2. Teacher Collaboration: During the 2016-2017 School-Year, the ScIP committee in conjunction with the principal will plan additional Teacher Collaboration events which will take place during scheduled faculty meetings. A total of 4/10 faculty meetings will be scheduled with a 30 minute collaboration block for teachers to discuss various topics during the school-year. An agenda and minutes will be generated for each of the four (4) collaboration sessions. This provides additional time when compared to the last school-year for teachers to collaborate and articulate on specific academic/pedagogical topics of interest. 100% of Teachers in attendance will participate which will be measured through signed attendance sheets.

## **16-17 Wallington Jr./Sr. High School Building-Based Objectives**

1. By May of 2017, the number of students who choose the response “often” or “almost always” to item 7c on the School Climate Survey will increase by 5%. Item 7c reads: “Please indicate how much you agree or disagree with the following: Thinking back over the past year in school, how often did you feel that the school work you were assigned was meaningful and important?” (2016 result: 22%...43% chose “sometimes.”)

2. By June of 2017, a minimum of 50% of students will respond “yes” to the following statement on a school climate survey: “Students at my school treat each other with respect.” (2016 result: 42%)
